## New York University To Break Ground On D.C. Building

New York University will break ground this month on its [mixed-use D.C. building](#) at 1307 L St. NW, bringing what is essentially a campus within a building to the 14th Street Corridor.

The Hickok Cole Architects-designed project will include 75,000 square feet with seminar rooms, offices and a 200-seat auditorium below six floors of dorms and apartments.

The 12-story project, called the Constance Milstein and Family Academic Center, will be home to 127 students and faculty each semester, with its first group of students arriving in fall 2012.

The university will hold a private ceremony at the St. Regis to celebrate the groundbreaking Sept. 20.
